Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As many of you know, the Lineage Warehouse Fire in Boyle Heights has had far-reaching consequences that extend well beyond the immediate area. The smoke, air quality concerns, and environmental impacts have been seen, felt, and experienced throughout much of Los Angeles County and the surrounding region by tens of thousands of residents, workers, families, and businesses have been affected as the fire continues to impact communities across Boyle Heights, East Los Angeles, and neighboring cities.

On behalf of Labor Community Services, we are reaching out to ask for your support in assisting union families impacted by the fire.

Labor Community Services is mobilizing relief efforts to provide critical assistance to union households impacted by the fire, including:

- Air purifiers to improve indoor air quality and reduce exposure to harmful smoke and contaminants
- PPE masks to help protect families from ongoing air quality concerns
- Food assistance for households facing financial hardship and disruption
- Personal hygiene products and other emergency relief supplies

Please let us know if you have any members residing within the immediate impact area of the fire who may require temporary housing due to smoke damage or unsafe living conditions resulting from the fire.

Your financial contribution will allow LCS to rapidly deploy these resources to affected families and ensure that no union household faces this crisis alone.


